A colleague told me about a Shabbat dinner he was invited to at a congregant's home. The Rabbi and his family entered the home to the wonderful smells of Shabbat.

The family and its guests gathered around the table. The sun had set several hours prior as it was the winter months. Nonetheless, it was the custom of this family to light Shabbat candles after sunset before they began the meal.

Although this observance ran contrary to Jewish law, the Rabbi chose not to say anything; he did not want to embarrass his gracious hosts. However, one of the other guests present at dinner chose to raise the issue. "Why are you lighting candles after sundown? Hasn't Shabbat already started?" asked one of the guests. The family, it turns out, had not given much thought to the idea that lighting candles after sundown ran contrary to Jewish law. They replied: "It's what our parents always did...why would we do anything different now?"

I've been thinking a lot about this story since I first heard it from a colleague. Are children always required to emulate what their parents do, let alone follow their wishes?

As Jewish children, there are any number of actions that we are supposed to perform to demonstrate respect and honor for our parents. These include not sitting in their favorite chairs at the table, caring for them when they are older, and not putting them to shame.

However, there are times when children are invited to overrule their parents' wishes. One of the examples that I encounter the most in my work are parents who tell their children that their final wishes are to be cremated. The children I meet are often uncomfortable with their parents' choice and are struggling themselves. They want to honor their parents' wishes, while also being fully aware that cremation is against Jewish law (not to mention in modern times, evokes images of

the Holocaust). In these circumstances, where parents act contrary to Jewish law in such a serious way, I explain they may in good conscience overrule their parents.



It's also true that parents may not always be good parents, in which case, children have a responsibility to break the cycle of abuse. In our relatively new Siddur, there is a specific passage for children to recite during the *Yizkor* memorial service. It is titled for a "parent who was hurtful". Reciting this passage during *Yizkor* strikes the right chord for children who want to be dutiful to their Jewish tradition while acknowledging the pain of the relationship.

In Judaism, we talk about children's obligations to parents. Rarely though do we spend enough time talking about parents' obligations to their children. The Rabbis have a principle: *Maaseh Avot Siman Levanim*, "that actions of parents create signposts for their children". The principle is a warning for parents that if we are not careful in our behavior, our children may choose to emulate not only our endearing qualities, but the ones that are less endearing. What we say. How we treat other people. Lighting candles, in my humble opinion, is small potatoes compared to what our children can and will emulate if we are not careful.

In the end, I am not sure that I would've acted any different than my colleague did. It's wonderful that this family wanted to light candles at all, even if I would have preferred it had been done in a more *halachic* way.

Nonetheless, we should never feel pressured to follow a practice "because our parents said so." Each generation forges its own path.



#### **SAY YES**



I started my very first Voice of Chaim article in February 2022 with the *Shehecheyanu*. As I wrote then, usually we say the *Shehecheyanu* in times of thanks or commemoration. Generally, it's when we are

experiencing something that truly nourishes our soul and occurs infrequently. Nothing I wrote two years ago about this meaningful blessing has changed, except that I am now on the other side of my presidential journey. I hope during my presidency I've encouraged you to find moments for yourself (perhaps a "Never Have I Ever" moment) that are so special or important they are worthy of being commemorated with the *Shehecheyanu*.

I am grateful there have been so many of these special and commemorative moments during my Etz Chaim Presidency. True to form, I will name THREE. (1) The congregation recited the *Shehecheyanu* at two installation Shabbat services. (2) Rabbi Dorsch, Marty Gilbert, and I said the *Shehecheyanu* at the closing table when we purchased the front five acres of property from the Lutheran Church. (3) Rabbi Adler and I chanted the *Shehecheyanu* when we signed his full-time contract together. These were (and are) three meaningful, significant, important moments that I was part of because of my role as President of Etz Chaim.

I also said the *Shehecheyanu* silently when we voted in our new Executive Committee and Board of Trustees at our annual meeting on December 3<sup>rd</sup>. I think most congregants know this, but just in case you don't, I'm going to SAY IT OUT LOUD. . . at Etz Chaim, we have a long established succession plan where the Executive Vice President of the synagogue is considered next in line to be President. So, when Lisa Olens was asked if she would accept the Executive Vice President role, she also was being asked if she would agree to be the future President of our congregation. Before saying yes, Lisa called a number of people at Etz Chaim. During our talk, I reflected on my feelings about being President of Etz Chaim.

You may have heard me say I LOVE BEING PRESIDENT OF ETZ CHAIM. Well, it's true. I told Lisa that when I was installed as President, I made a commitment to myself to GO ALL IN. I poured every ounce of energy and time into these past two years. I wanted to show up for as many events, activities, learning sessions, shivas, social opportunities, minyans, and meetings as possible. I wanted to be present, soak it up, and see it in action. That's how I chose to engage as President.

In doing so, here's what I discovered - THE MORE I GAVE, THE MORE I RECEIVED. While this was a huge endeavor (and it was scary and overwhelming at times), when I look back on it, I am so grateful I was trusted with this position and I am so proud of myself for SAYING YES. I told Lisa that if she was at a point in her life to be able to SAY YES, she should not hesitate.

I say the same to all of you . . . when you are asked to volunteer and give of your time and energy, SAY YES if possible. I promise you will get more out of it than you give. If you aren't able to say yes, try "not right now, but ask me again at another time." You will not be disappointed. Instead, you will find that the more you contribute, the more you grow, and the more you learn. So don't hesitate, SAY YES.

Here I am now, four years after I SAID YES (two as E.VP and two as President) and I am reciting the *Shehecheyanu* again. This time it's to celebrate that I have reached the end of my Presidential term with an excellent professional staff, a deeply committed Executive Committee, an engaged and thoughtful Board of Trustees, and so many other lay leaders who dedicate their time to our very special community. Thank you for giving me the opportunity to SAY YES to serve Congregation Etz Chaim.

**Kitah Hey in Action** 

Kitah Hay is high energy, enthusiastic about improving their Hebrew skills and marked by insightful discussion. Throughout the year, they return to the idea that they are part of a community and that their actions are impactful.

The students have become very comfortable using their Siddurim and are currently learning the Amidah. The students practice prayers both on the Bimah (during joint Tefillah sessions with 6th and 7th grade) and working in small groups in the classroom. They also work on Hebrew skills with words relevant to holidays and from the weekly Torah portion.

One component of Kitah Hay's Judaic studies is, of course, holidays. Our focus is understanding the reasons for our observances and what they mean to us. During the High Holy Days, we explored the idea that Teshuvah can be the process of returning to our best selves. As Chanukah approached, we learned about the role of the Second Temple in Jewish life and why the rededication was so important.

The other component of Kitah Hay's Judaic studies is a project-based learning endeavor. The students have been challenged to answer the question, "Why is it said of the Matriarchs and Patriarchs that we stand on the shoulders of giants?" Once they have completed their research and deliberations, they will be tasked with making something to share the answer with others. It will be fascinating to see what they create!

This month I would like to highlight our Monkeys Class. The Monkeys are our second 14 month – 24 month and walking class. Their teachers, Mrs. Faer and Ms. Feibel make each day fun and exciting to be a Monkey!

At any given time, you can walk into their classroom and see the children engaged in various sensory activities. Whether it is playing with playdough, exploring materials in the sensory table, playing on the climbing equipment, or taste-testing a new fruit, these teachers make sure that the children are engaged in meaningful experiences each day. Every week you can find the Monkeys mixing and stirring ingredients to make their own challah for Shabbat. The children have opportunities to sing songs, listen to stories, and enjoy finger puppet chants throughout their day. Mrs. Faer loves to come to work each day because she says, "They give me what my 19- and 21-year-old daughters won't give me anymore — lots of snuggles, hugs, and kisses! I also enjoy teaching them Judaics because it brings me back to my Religious School days!"

The Monkeys love to celebrate holidays and you can often hear them singing songs about each celebration. Ms. Feibel brings such creativity to the class. She is always coming up with ideas to present to the children to allow them to experience the processes of art. Ms. Feibel said, "My favorite part of being the Monkeys teacher is watching them grow and change, literally day to day!" The children in this class have so many opportunities to be a part of developmentally appropriate experiences as they are growing and changing and learning how to engage with each other every day.

Contributions made to the Chesed Fund will help to fund these services.


